Virgin-More is a homoerotic poem in rhymed couplets initially set in 1979 about the first time sexual experience of 2 college students. The guys go back to Virgin's apartment for kissing, conversation and sex and then a discussion on gay men, sex and spirit. While there is no actual sex in this piece, there is frank language, kissing and partial nudity. The story is told a second time using another set of actors playing different characters who live out a similar story. But the second time the story takes a unique direction.

Alex Dorr (Virgin West) is a recent graduate from Marymount Manhattan's BFA acting program. Some of his favorite credits include: Richard III (American Globe Theater), Les Miserable (Ogunquit Playhouse), and Round Midnight (American Globe Theater).
